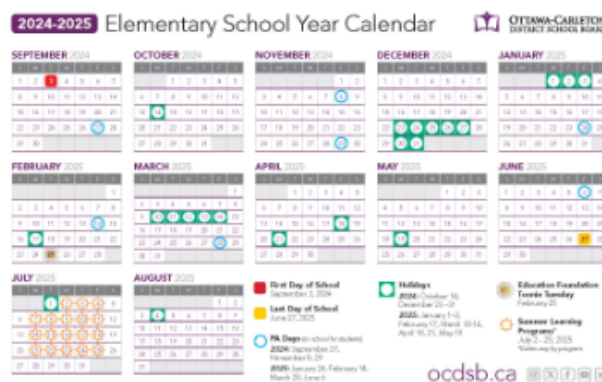

OUR SCHOOL DAY

Our school works on a balanced school day schedule from Monday to Friday, with three large blocks of instructional time and two nutritional breaks.

At Henry Munro, we value learning time. Please make sure that your child arrives on time for school ready to learn. As well, please try to schedule appointments (medical,

dental or other) at times where it does not interfere with learning. We thank you in advance.

School Procedures

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is the basis for academic achievement and success in school. The Ontario government requires that all students attend classes punctually and regularly. Families are asked to report any lates or absences by either calling 1-833-202-1417 or using the School Messenger App or going to the website go.schoolmessenger.ca before 8:30am. Please use [this document](#) to assist you with our system.

Parental permission is required for a student to leave the school during the school day. If your child is being picked up, it is necessary to identify who will be picking them up. We will not release a child to an unidentified person without a written note. The adult must sign out students at the office. Upon returning to school the student must report to the office to sign in.

If buses are cancelled - Parents of bused students do not have to call in their absences as it is assumed that they will stay home.

PARENTS OF STUDENTS WHO DO NOT TAKE A BUS must report their absences.

- ★ It is very important that the Main Office be informed of any address, telephone and/or email changes so that the school can reach parents/guardians during the school day when necessary or in case of an emergency. Your parent/guardian can update your contact information by email to henrymunrooms@ocdsb.ca

LATE ARRIVAL

Students are expected to be in class and on time. All students who arrive late to school must sign in at the main office. Recurring absences and/or lates are documented. If required, the Vice-Principal and school Social Worker will work with a family in order to support school routines and rectify lates and absences.

PARKING AND STUDENT DROP OFF

We ask that all adults dropping off children at the school refrain from using the drop off loop or parking their vehicle in the parking lot. No vehicles should ever be stopped or parked in the bus loop. During school start-up, monitors will be present to guide you. Arrival and dismissal are busy times so please consider asking your child to walk, bike (or other) to school. If you must use your vehicle for transportation, please consider parking on a side street or using the *Annunciation of the Lord Church* parking lot and then walking.

TRANSPORTATION

Students must observe safe rules of conduct while on school buses. In cases where safety rules are not followed, the driver will first seek the cooperation of the student. If the student will not cooperate, the driver will report the student to the principal or vice-principal, who will take whatever corrective action is warranted. For repeated problems, this may include the withdrawal of transportation services for a specific period of time.

While travelling on a bus, students must abide by all HMMS policies and the OCDSB student code of conduct. Failure to do so may result in withdrawal of bus privileges.

You must get on and off your bus at the assigned time and stop.

Students are only permitted to ride the bus to which they are assigned.

BICYCLES, SKATEBOARDS, ROLLER BLADES, ETC.

Students riding bicycles to school should be prepared to secure them while at school. Henry Munro is not responsible for the security of bicycles left at school. Bicycles, skateboards and rollerblades (and others) should not be ridden once a student is on Henry Munro property. Students are asked to walk their bicycles when on school grounds. Bicycle helmets must be worn by all cyclists under the age of 18 years old.

YARD SUPERVISION

Supervision in our school yard begins at 7:45am. Students may arrive from 7:45am on to ensure their safety. Students must be picked up at 2:30pm when school ends. There is no supervision on the yard after 2:30pm.

RECESS

Students will be going outside everyday for recess. The office monitors the weather for heavy rain or extreme cold and will make decisions accordingly. Students must be dressed for the day's weather. Light rain will not result in an indoor recess. Jackets with hoods are optimal for our unpredictable weather conditions.

HALL AND YARD ROUTINES

In order to promote safety in the school when moving from class to class, students should walk at all times in an orderly fashion. The front schoolyard and the parking lot areas are out of bounds to students unless under the supervision of a staff member.

LOCKERS

Lockers are the property of the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board. They are on loan to students and must be properly maintained.

Lockers are assigned at the beginning of the school year and you may use only the one locker registered to you and are not to be shared with another student.

Combination locks are encouraged as your locker combination is shared with the Homeroom Teacher. Keyed locks will be cut in the event that the locker needs to be

accessed.

Locks are available in the Main Office for \$5.00.

Students must clear out their lockers at the end of the school year; if not, valuables left behind will be donated to a local charity.

A search of lockers by School or District Administration is lawful at any time, without notifying the occupant, if there is reasonable cause to do so.

The school cannot assume any responsibility for items kept in student lockers. If you bring valuable items to school, you do so at your own risk. It doesn't happen very often but sometimes locker theft does happen. If this should occur, report the incident to the Main Office as soon as possible.

ATHLETICS

We encourage students to participate in sports activities offered at school. One of the best things you can do is to try out for school teams. Get involved! Playing for your school is a rewarding educational experience. Acceptable standards of behaviour, attendance, and academic progress must be maintained to remain eligible to participate, as stated in the Athletic Code of Conduct.

Student-Athletes are privileged to represent Henry Munro Middle School and should conduct themselves as suitable ambassadors for our school at all times. All sporting events are school sanctioned. This includes games, practices and tournaments. Students are required to conduct themselves in accordance with OCDSB and HMMS policy for all school-related activities. HMMS Lions are expected to be role-models and ambassadors of inclusive, team-building behaviour. HMMS Athletics does not condone any threatening, bullying, or abusive behaviour toward any student. All hazing-type activities are strictly forbidden. Inappropriate behaviour will result in consequences from coaches and school Administration.

It is a privilege to be on a team, not a right!

DRESS CODE

All students have the right to express themselves in school through their choice of clothing, hair styles, jewellery, and accessories.

While a student's style is their choice, we want to keep school a place where everyone can feel comfortable.

In April 2022, the OCDSB Board of Trustees approved updates to the [Safe Schools Policies](#), which includes the updated [School District Code of Conduct](#) (that contains a section on dress code). The process to update these policies began in 2019 and included consultations with students, families, staff and community members on a variety of issues, including dress code.

The new student dress code applies to all schools. All students have the right to express themselves through their dress without fear of body shaming, bias, or discrimination.

SCENTS, COLOGNE/PERFUMES

Strong scents can have an impact on students and staff with sensitivities. Personal scented products beyond deodorants or antiperspirants should NOT be used. Spraying body spray or perfume within the school is prohibited.

SMOKING/VAPING

Smoking/vaping is forbidden at any time, on any school premises, on buses or at any school/athletic event. Students will be subject to disciplinary action by Administration.

VISITORS TO OUR SCHOOL

We welcome visitors such as parents, guardians, grandparents, volunteers and other helpers. For security purposes, all visitors must report to the school's main office to sign in and obtain an identification badge to wear at all times while on school property. All visitors must make arrangements with the staff prior to coming into the building. Field trip volunteers will be contacted by the responsible staff member.

APPROPRIATE USE OF TECHNOLOGY

Henry Munro Middle School and the OCDSB recognize the benefits that technology can bring to support student learning. Our policy ([P.100.IT](#)) sets the expectation that the technology at school is used for educational purposes only. Students are given an Appropriate Use of Technology Agreement at the beginning of the year to review with families, sign and return to the school. These agreements support your child towards becoming a positive digital citizen and understanding the etiquette of responsible use, which supports their learning environment. Any unacceptable use of technology at school may result in the removal of this privilege. Students are expected to use school technology under the supervision of staff.

Failure to follow expectations will result in follow-up with their teacher and Admin and the device will be confiscated and brought to the office for safekeeping.

- Offence #1: Pick it up at end of the day.
- Offence #2: Phone or email to parents
- Offence #3: Parents pick up and the item is no longer permitted at school (duration to be determined by Educator/Admin).

These expectations are reviewed and reinforced with students throughout the school year.

PERSONAL DEVICES

The use of personal devices during instructional time will be permitted only under the following circumstances:

- For educational purposes, as directed by an educator
- For health and medical purposes, as directed by a physician
- To support special education needs as identified through an Individual Education Plan

COMMUNICATION

Communication is an important part of your child's schooling. Staff can be reached either by phone, email or note. The majority of school communication is sent through our website and email messages to families. Google Classrooms can be accessed by students and their families.

EMERGENCY DISMISSAL

Occasionally it may be necessary to dismiss students early. For their safety, please ensure that alternate arrangements are made and rehearsed with them, taking care to always update the school records with the Office Administrator.

FIELD TRIP PROCEDURES

Students will receive a field trip permission form for every activity off school property. Without a parent's/guardian's written consent on the appropriate Board form, the child cannot participate in the activity. In accordance with the procedures established by the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board, we are unable to accept hand-written notes or telephone calls to approve field trips. Completing the online forms as promptly as possible is appreciated. Payment for field trips is accessible through *School Cash Online*.

As field trips are a privilege, be aware that due to poor attendance, poor academic performance or for behavioural reasons, students can be notified that they are not eligible to attend field trips or sporting events.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

The HMMS Council is here to help increase communication between the school and our community and to serve the needs of students. HMMS Council cooperates with our school principal and is an important link between parents and the school community. Our meetings are always open to all parents and guardians in the Henry Munro community even if they do not wish to become HMMS Council members.

HMMS Council is a valuable home/school link that supports the learning environment of our students and children.

HMMS Council acts in an advisory capacity providing ideas and input to assist the principal and where appropriate, school board trustees, in their decision making on educational issues.

The HMMS Council membership includes parents (elected by parents), the principal, one member of the teaching staff, one non-teaching staff representative and, if possible, an appointed community member.

All parents/guardians are welcome to attend. Elections for the School Council Executive take place at the September meeting.

This year, the Henry Munro Middle School Council will be meeting in a hybrid format - in-person and Google Meet. All parents and guardians in the HMMS community are invited to attend!
